What is Title I?

Druid Hills High School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA). Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Druid Hills High School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

By the end of the year 2024, students will improve mastery of academically rigorous learning literacy standards and improve mastery of academically rigorous learning standards in math as measured by: 1. a six (6%) percent increase in the number of students scoring at the developing learner level or higher on Georgia Milestones End Of Course Tests; 2. meeting the state subgroup target percentage increases for (a) Economically Disadvantaged (b) English Language Learners (c) Students with Disabilities; 3. a five (5%) percent increase in the percent of students scoring at the Distinguished Learner level on Georgia Milestone End Of Course Tests. 4. 55% of students will meet or exceed their mean expected growth projection for reading, language and math RIT scores on MAP assessment. 5. AP scores of 3 or better will increase by 5% to 72%. 6. IB will increase number of students earning the IB diploma.
